### Annex B

### Licensing Conditions for Licence to Store Explosives

1. The licensee may only store the type of explosives as stated in the licence unless otherwise approved by the Licensing Officer in writing.

2. The licensee may only store explosives in the explosives storage as stated in the licence unless otherwise approved by the Licensing Officer in writing.

3. The licensee is required to maintain a register showing the following:

- (a) The description of the explosives;
- (b) The date the explosives were taken into stock;
- (c) The quantity of explosives in/out/balance;
- (d) The movement of explosives; and
- (e) The particulars of person drawing / depositing explosives or entering the explosives storage.

4. The licensee must keep the register in condition 3 above for a period of not less than 10 years from the date the record is made.

5. The licensee must provide for intrusion detection system to detect break-in or unauthorised access into the explosives storage.

6. The licensee shall ensure that closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras and CCTV recording system(s) are installed and maintained in accordance with the following requirements:(a) The licensee shall ensure that there are CCTV cameras covering all entrances and exits directly leading to/from:

i. the armoury; and

ii. the interior of the armoury where the arms are stored.

(b) At all times, the licensee shall ensure that all the conditions below are met:

i. each CCTV camera is positioned and angled in such a way that it can capture the face of every person entering or exiting through that doorway, or depositing, removing or handling any arm in the armoury; and

ii. there is an unobstructed line of sight from the CCTV cameras to the locations they are covering.(c) The licensee shall ensure that all CCTV cameras and recording system(s) meet or exceed the following specifications:

i. records colour images at the resolution of HD 1080p: 1920x1080 pixels or its equivalent;

ii. records at 12 frames per second;

iii. supports the exporting of CCTV camera recordings via a USB port in open-source formats such as \*.avi (Microsoft), \*.mov (Apple QuickTime), \*.mp4 (MPEG), or such format as approved by the Licensing Officer in writing;

iv. is switched on and in a recording mode at all times; and

v. is able to store all CCTV camera recordings for at least 31 days from the date of recording.

7. The licensee must ensure the CCTV Digital Video Recorder is locked up in a secured room.

8. The licensee is required to obtain the Licensing Officer's approval before employing any prospective employees to handle explosives, by submitting an application for "Clearance for Special Worker (Add New Employee)" through the GoBusiness System.

9. The licensee must ensure that only staff approved by the Licensing Officer can be authorised to access to the explosives stored in the explosives storage.

10. Where any person ceases to be employed by the licensee, the licensee must notify the Licensing Officer within 7 days cessation of employment by submitting an application for "Amendment to Existing Employees" through the GoBusiness System.

11. The licensee must notify the Licensing Officer of any change to the business address at least 7 days before the change takes effect.

12. The licensee must immediately notify the Police if there is any:

- (a) loss of any explosive;
- (b) entry of any unauthorised person into the approved explosives storage;
- (c) unauthorised person attempting to take part in any transportation of explosive; or
- (d) security or safety related incident.

13. The licensee shall allow and facilitate any audit or inspection (including any surprise check) of the explosive or licensed premises by the Licensing Officer or any officer authorised by the Licensing Officer in writing. For avoidance of doubt, an authorised officer may:

(a) enter any licensed premises

(b) inspect the licensed premises and any explosive found within;

(c) photograph or film, or make a record or sketches of, any part of the premises, or any person or thing at the premises;

(d) require any person on those premises to produce or grant access to, without charge, any document, information or article reasonably required, which is in the possession or under the control of that person;

(e) inspect and make copies of or take extracts from any such document or article; and

(f) take possession of such a document or article if, in the opinion of the authorised officer that the inspection or copying of or extraction from the document or article cannot reasonably be performed without taking possession, the document or article may be interfered with or destroyed unless possession is taken, or the document or article may be required as evidence in any proceedings instituted or commenced under the Arms & Explosives Act 1913.

### Licensing Conditions for Licence to Supply Explosives

1. The licensee may only deal in the types of explosives as stated in the licence unless otherwise approved by the Licensing Officer in writing.

2. The licensee is required to maintain stock books/records showing the following particulars: - Explosives Stock/Record

(a) Date on which any explosive was taken into stock;

- (b) Number of import licence or the name of the person from whom purchased or received;
- (c) Description of the explosives;
- (d) Quantity of each description sold, exported or transferred and
- (e) Number of purchase or export licence

3. The licensee shall keep all stock and sales records for a period of not less than 10 years from the date the record is made.

4. The licensee shall only store explosives in a storage place approved by the Licensing Officer, including any temporary storage; e.g. pending delivery, while arranging for security during transportation of explosives.

5. The licensee shall ensure that once imported, all explosives are immediately delivered to a storage place approved by the Licensing Officer.

6. The licensee shall ensure that only authorised persons (i.e. the licensee himself and/or his on-duty staff, and/or armed Auxiliary Police Officers (APO) engaged to perform the escort) are involved in the

transportation of any explosives. The licensee shall ensure that no detour takes place during the transportation of the explosives.

7. The licensee shall ensure that any explosives to be transported shall be jointly inspected with the delivery staff assigned and/or armed APO engaged to perform the escort before the transportation commences. Upon the arrival at the approved destination, the licensee shall ensure that a joint inspection is carried out by the delivery staff assigned and/or armed APO and the recipient before handing over the explosives to the recipient.

8. The licensee shall ensure that all inspections, handing over and taking over procedures are properly documented and endorsed by all relevant parties such as the licensee, the sender, and the recipient.

9. Where any explosive needs to be disposed of, the licensee shall dispose of it in such a manner as prescribed by the Licensing Officer.

10. The licensee is required to obtain the Licensing Officer's approval before employing any prospective employees to handle explosives, by submitting an application for "Clearance for Special Worker (Add New Employee)" through the GoBusiness System.

11. The licensee shall ensure that only staff approved by the Licensing Officer can be authorised to access or handle explosives.

12. Where any person ceases to be employed by the licensee, the licensee shall notify the Licensing Officer within 7 days of the cessation of employment by submitting an application for "Amendment to Existing Employees" through the GoBusiness System.

13. The licensee shall notify the Licensing Officer of any change to the business address, at least 7 days before the change takes effect.

- 14. The licensee shall immediately notify the Police if there is any:
- (a) loss of any explosive;
- (b) entry of any unauthorised person into the approved explosive storage;
- (c) unauthorised person attempting to take part in any transportation of explosive; or

(d) security or safety related incident.

15. The licensee shall allow and facilitate any audit or inspection (including any surprise check) of the explosive, or licensed premises by the Licensing Officer or any officer authorised by the Licensing Officer in writing. For avoidance of doubt, an authorised officer may:

(a)enter any licensed premises;

(b)inspect the licensed premises and any explosive found within;

(c)photograph or film, or make a record or sketches of, any part of the premises, or any person or thing at the premises;

(d)require any person on those premises to produce or grant access to, without charge, any document, information or article reasonably required, which is in the possession or under the control of that person;

(e)inspect and make copies of or take extracts from any such document or article; and

(f)take possession of such a document or article if, in the opinion of the authorised officer that the inspection or copying of or extraction from the document or article cannot reasonably be performed without taking possession, the document or article may be interfered with or destroyed unless possession is taken, or the document or article may be required as evidence in any proceedings instituted or commenced under the Arms & Explosives Act 1913.
